

There are 2 vacancies in the Community Age Care Packages (CACP)program as existing clients transfer to residential care, when CACP cannot meet their needs. After the very successful Cricket competition in Summer we are planning a Soccer Competition this winter in an effort to encourage our youth to participate in sport. AAA RENOVATION

As no doubt our members are aware, the hall and kitchen at Asia House badly needed attention due to constant use by our members, clients, and supporters. We made an application to Lotterywest for funding to upgrade the facilities, to ensure that we comply with

the Occupational Health and Safety legislation as well as meet the needs of our community members.

We wish to thank LOTTERYWEST publicly for their grant of approximately \$ 300,000 to upgrade the Hall floor, the kitchen, the lift, the sound and lighting. We regret the inconvenience caused to our members, clients and supporters while this important work was being carried out, but we are confident that you are all pleased with the result.

We wish to remind our members that the facilities at AAA house belong to you – our members and therefore we expect the facilities to be used and cared for like your own.

Brand new **WOODEN BOARDS** replaced the old floor boards. They were sanded, sealed and finished. Please try not to drag the tables and chairs because the scratch marks damage both the sealer and the finish.

The ground floor **ELECTRICAL SYSTEM** was completely re-wired.

The interior of the **LIFT** has been re-conditioned and it is electrically powered. The lift can be called from both the ground floorand the first floor. This would be a great help especially for our elderly clients and mothers with babies in prams.

The **KITCHEN** has been remodelled with stainless steel benches and shelving providing plenty of work spaces. The sinks are deep allowing users to wash large pots and pans with functional modern Tapware.

Two severies have been provided so that food from the kitchen can be served to the Main Hall and the Lesser Hall.

Conditions for use of our new facilities are placed in different locations in the building. Please respect our request to use the facilities with care and always remember to leave the premises in the same condition as you would like to have it, when you wish to use it.

We will be commencing the upgrade of the sound and lighting very soon.




