3. The views and needs of carers must be taken into account along with the views, needs and best interests of people receiving care when decisions are made that impact on carers and the role of carers.
4. Complaints made by carers in relation to services that impact on them and the role of carers must be given due attention and consideration.

Disability Support Services



The Australian Asian Association T/A Triple A Care has historically been a multicultural Aged Care Service Provider, for people from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) communities.

We have identified a need for culturally specific services for people with disabilities and their families regardless of their age. In light of this, we have expanded the scope of our services to include support to individuals with disabilities from the various ethnic backgrounds including support to all Australians who need Disability Support Service.

Our focus is on tailored support to assist the individual to be as independent as possible, to increase their confidence and foster meaningful friendships connection with family and chosen community. We do our best to provide a support worker who speaks the same language as you and comes from the same or similar cultural background. We also roster the same support worker to provide the service as far as possible to ensure continuity.

The Australia Asia House Day Centre and the bathroom are located in the ground floor and is wheel chair accessible. A lift is available to access the offices.



Some of the services we provide are:

- Support with daily living tasks which include personal care and domestic tasks such as meal preparation/cooking, cleaning and shopping.
- Assisting individuals to access the community for social activities.
- Assisting the carer by providing In-Home support/respice so the carer may be relieved to undertake family activities or have a break. We can also assist with out of home activities such as individual or centre-based activities.
